Tours are hosted by a TyRex family member and TeleRex follows the guide throughout the facility ensuring our guests see everything we have to offer. CEO and Partner Andrew Cooper virtually guided Westwood High School's engineering club throughout the facility – along the way, students met with TyRex Technology Family experts and engineers who gave insight into the different kinds of manufacturing capabilities TyRex possesses.

At one time as many as 30 TyRex Business Family members worked from home. Now we have nearly everyone back working in our manufacturing facilities.



STEM Mentorship by TyRex - Despite a Pandemic!

Even with the pandemic keeping us apart, our team has found some creative ways to lend our time to local STEM initiatives. In one of the more inspiring projects, TekRex's **Nathan Bosch** helped a team of students from Westwood High School that was creating a competition-worthy, fully electric formula car capable of competing in events such as Circuit Racing and Hill Climbs. This team of students, also known as Armature Racing, reached out to TekRex because of their need for a custom printed steering wheel. Nathan used his design for manufacturing expertise to optimize the print for our Carbon M2 CLIP printer and presented it pro bono to the team. We are excited to be listed as one of Armature Racing's Build Mentors.

Joel Coffman also represented TyRex as a judge for Westwood High School's Tech Starters Demo Day. Tech Starters is a new STEM and business extracurricular club, where high school students are given the opportunity to experience a professional work environment and create a STEM-related product by the end of the semester. Demo Day was the culmination of a semester long project for five student groups, who created and presented their mobile applications to judges from many different industries. The judges gave awards based on the Most Creative Concept, Best Execution of Concept and Best Overall - the winning team created a personal planning mobile application specifically designed for busy high school students. Other ideas included a scholarship finder, a recycling information app, an improvement on existing fitness apps and a college major guide.

Finally, big TyRex shout-out to **Rob Sparks**, who donated his time and design engineering expertise not once but twice to Vista Ridge High's "INCubator" program helping students think through technical design details on the products they were developing. One group had designs for foldable furniture, and another designed a wearable cooling system to improve upon the personal misting devices currently on the market. "You are a Godsend to our program!" said lead teacher Dana Jones.






